#### **May Overview**

May (in Latin, Maius) was named for the Greek goddess Maia, who was identified with the Roman era goddess of fertility, Bona Dea, whose festival was held in May. Conversely, the Roman poet Ovid provides a second etymology, in which he says that the month of May is named for the maiores, Latin for "elders," and that the following month (June) is named for the iuniores, or "young people"

Mayovka, in the context of the late Russian Empire, was a picnic in the country-side or in a park in the early days of May, hence the name. Eventually, "mayovka" came to mean an illegal celebration of May 1 by revolutionary public, typically presented as an innocent picnic.

Special devotions to the Virgin Mary take place in May.

#### **May Zodiacs**

The two zodiac signs associated with the month of May are Taurus April 21-May 20 and Gemini May 21– July 20

The sign of Taurus is associated with several myths and bull worship from sever-

al ancient cultures. It was the first sign of the zodiac established among the Mesopotamians, who called it "The Great Bull of Heaven," as it was the constellation through which the Sun rose on the vernal equinox at that time, that is the Early Bronze Age, from about 4000 BC to 1700 BC.

## Living, Loving, Local for May Rhubarb and Asparagus

Rhubarb has been around for centuries and before it was ever considered for human

consumption it was used for medicinal purposes as a laxative. It is believed to be partially responsible for the disappearance of Scurvy (Vitamin C deficiency) and



was one of the original fruits used for tarts and pies dating back to the 1760's. It has so many culinary uses from savory to sweet, from jams to jellies as well as eaten fresh dipped in a bit of sugar. With advancements made in the cultivation of this plant we can enjoy fresh rhubarb from January right through until almost September.



Asparagus is like the tulip of spring flowers – from the first true winter thaw, the warm sun and moist soil sprouts the asparagus spear. It is one of the first green edibles to be commercially harvested in our northern Ontario climate. For locavores it evokes the promise of the delicious harvest season to come.
